NEW! THE JUBILEE WOOD

A muddy field alongside the railway line will be the site of a new Nutfield community woodland – let's call it Jubilee Wood, as it is part of the Jubilee Fields to the east of the village. The Parish Council have given the go ahead to the Tree Wardens to begin planting trees there. The first batch will come from the charity the Woodland Trust, which is giving away free packs of young native trees for community projects. The Tree Wardens applied for a batch and were successful.

The first lot of trees will be enough for an acre, about the size of a football pitch, and planting will be over next winter. Watch this space, as the Tree Wardens would like as many people as possible to volunteer to help – not just to plant the trees, but to look after them in the years to come until they are established. They will have to be protected against rabbits and deer at the time they are planted, and mulched with a thick layer of hay to stop weeds from swamping them as they grow.

However, by far the best trees to have in a new native woodland are trees grown locally. So here are some ideas for everyone.

Calling on gardeners: Maybe in the spring tidy-up of the garden you will see a seedling oak, or hazel, or holly, or willow, or hawthorn. Don't put it in the compost heap: plant it out, or pot it up, and let it grow over summer. It can be planted next winter on tree planting day. No ash please, as ash dieback is taking a heavy toll, and few saplings are surviving. And no fancy non-native trees either! The field is tough Nutfield clay: tough native trees are needed.

"Be a Jay for the Day". One for the children - in all of us! The most prolific planter of oak trees in the country is that bright bird with the turquoise flash, the jay. It buries acorns to eat later, and then forgets. The acorn sprouts, and a new tree takes root. Autumn is the time for seed gathering: we could all be jays for a day and plant a forest.

The Jubilee Wood is a long-term project. We are all being exhorted to plant trees these days as an answer to the climate emergency. This could be Nutfield's small contribution. Just as important, is the huge impact trees have on biodiversity, so important at a time when bird and insect numbers are in sharp decline. The Tree Wardens have launched the scheme, but we need lots of you to come up with ideas and help with the planting and aftercare. Please be in touch if you are interested.

HEDGEHOG AWARENESS WEEK 3rd – 9th MAY



Surrey Wildlife Trust reports the UK has become one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world and one in seven species is at risk of extinction. The Wildlife Trusts are shedding light on some of the problems our wildlife faces every day. We've reached a point where our natural world is in a critical condition and needs our help.

It's not too late to bring our wildlife back, but we must act now!

A drastic decline in species that are affected by climate change, erratic weather and unreliable seasons mean that they find it harder to nest and feed. Please help endangered hedgehogs and benefit other wildlife by;

- Linking your gardens with hedgehog holes (13 x 13cm)
- Making ponds safe - they will drown if can't climb out
- Put out water & food for Hedgehogs - meaty cat food, wet or dry
- Stop using chemicals & always check before strimming
- Create a wild corner & build a log pile

Crime Report for February:

Over the past few weeks or so we have seen an increase in motor vehicle offences in the Tandridge area. Catalytic Converters are being stolen from specific vehicles. Makes & Models specifically being targeted are Lexus RX400, Honda Accord & Jazz, Toyota Prius & Auris.

Kings Mill Lane, South Nutfield – On the afternoon of 07/02/20 a youngish male offender stole goods from a store and when pursued produced a knife as he made off.

CCTV

The CCTV survey responses was overwhelmingly (99.5%) in favour of the installation of a system within the parish. We are now conducting feasibility surveys with a security consultant to determine where to place cameras, what type of cameras we should use and costs. We are advised by the local police that based on the performance of other local systems (Bletchingley and Smallfield) the type of crimes shown above will dramatically reduce.

Highways

We received several applications for the post of Highways Assistant and following interviews we have appointed Richard Crutchfield to the role. Richard will be touring the parish looking for highway's defects and reporting to the appropriate authority. Hopefully this will mean repairs will be carried out sooner than at present.

On 6th March at the Tandridge District Council 'Local Committee', a committee of County and District Councillors and SCC Highways officers, Nutfield Parish Council raised three questions about the state of highways.

Kings Cross Lane between Mid Street and the Avenue is to be repaired using the County Councillors' 'Highways Fund for 2020/21'. Estimates are currently being received.

Trindles Road – potholes. These have now been repaired

Kings Cross Lane road closure. This was for repairs to drainage by Netherleigh Park.

If you spot a road defect please 'Report It' to SCC via www.surreycc.gov.uk or 0300 200 1003. It will then get referred to the appropriate roads team who can repair it.

Nutfield Green Activity Park

Many residents attended the March Parish Council meeting to discuss the clearance work at the former Laportes land. No planning application has yet been submitted so the Parish Council were unable to discuss this matter. The managing agents had advised the Parish Council in December that shrub clearance works were to take place over the winter, and this was repeated in the January edition of the Link.

Bulk waste collection day

Saturday 25th April is a bulk waste collection day. (**check the TDC website in case this is cancelled**). Tandridge District Council will collect large items between noon and 2.15pm from North Station Approach. Old dustbins will be collected together with any other large items.

Memorial Hall

A height restriction barrier has been installed in the car park of the Memorial Hall to prevent any unauthorised vehicles, other than cars, from entering the lower car parking area. We hope this will improve security at the hall.

Nutfield Cemetery

Nutfield Burial Board has noticed a marked increase in dog fouling and other waste (including human!) being deposited within the Cemetery. If this practice does not reduce, we feel that dogs (other than assistance dog) will have to be prohibited from the Cemetery. If you see any dog walkers not clearing up after their animals, please tell them.

What does the Parish Council do?

We felt it would be useful to set out the role of the Parish Council following the recent events on the former Laportes land.

The Parish Council

- Undertakes a monitoring role on planning application to protect the green belt and ensures inappropriate or over-development does not take place.
- Manages the Cemetery & Woodland Burial grounds, Jubilee fields and the Memorial Hall playing fields.
- Responds to consultations and attends meetings on transport, planning, housing & education.
- Has liaison meetings with the Police on crime and anti-social behaviour within the parish.
- Represents the Parish interests on various bodies, such as the BIFFA landfill,

Gatwick airport consultative committee, Redhill Aerodrome consultative committee and Tandridge District Council Parish Assembly.

- Is responsible for the Memorial Hall playground.
- Looks to make improvements within the Parish.
- Holds open discussion with Parishioners.

CLEARANCE OF LAND BEHIND SHORTACRES AND PARK WOOD ROAD

The owners of the land that was owned previously by Laportes have been clearing and levelling large areas behind Shortacres and Park Wood Road off the A25 at top Nutfield.

While the initial advice was that shrub clearance was to be carried out, no one was made aware of the considerable extent of this work. This has caused concern to residents because of the loss of essential habitat to deer, foxes, rabbits, owls and nesting birds, as well as making footpath areas impassable due to the muddy conditions.

The local people of Nutfield who live near and use these areas were not informed about the extent of clearing works that took place, with signs erected afterwards stating that their maintenance is to benefit local residents, e.g. clearance of footpaths. The steps taken by the owners have gone far beyond this and the feeling is that the clearance will be linked to a planning application which may be presented in late Spring/Summer 2020 to include more than 100 houses, a stroke centre and activity centre among other rumoured plans.

If the application gets accepted, it would mean a loss of woodland and fields and put more strain on our services and roads with higher pollution levels and increased lorry movements (thought to be as much as one additional lorry on the A25 every 4 minutes for 4 years). The state of the A25 due to the potholes and debris will also become even worse with the increased traffic. The access roads for the development indicated on the plans appear impractical and dangerous due to congestion that would be generated by the extra cars and lorries on our extremely busy A25 and Church Hill.

The Nutfield Noticeboard on Facebook has been a great way of alerting villagers to the events regarding this but not everyone is a member. We are reaching out to everyone who is interested in preserving our village community through The Nutfield Link. The Nutfield Conservation Society are closely monitoring things and have the proposed plans and updates whenever relevant.

Please keep an eye out for more information on this development so that you can make your views known when any planning application or meetings are held and let us know if you would like to get more involved.

VILLAGE FOOTPATH WALKS

The March walk was again very muddy after the storms and rain of the previous month. There were 17 of us who met at Nutts Corner, including visitors from Sussex and Essex. We started along Scout Hut Lane and then continued into the fields beyond which proved quite challenging to several members of the group because of the mud. Climbing the hill to Lyttle Hall, we then took the track by High Beech where we needed to navigate round a couple of fallen trees. The snowdrops nearby were nearly over but there were some daffodils in flower. Turning the corner to go parallel to the motorway we saw that it was closed on the northbound side for the works to make a smart motorway.

Returning to Coopers Hill Road, we took the path back to Mid Street by the Old Bakery and then walked by Braes Mead up the hill to get a good view of the village and beyond. We descended along Bower Hill Lane which seemed unusually busy with traffic, possibly as a consequence of the motorway closure. Crossing over the railway, which was still closed following a landslip near Edenbridge, we crossed more muddy fields by Brays Farm to the Recreation Field and back to Mid Street.

The next walk will be on Sunday 5th April, starting at 2.30 pm when we will meet at the lay-by at the junction of Kings Cross Lane and Kings Mill Lane for a walk to East Surrey Hospital and back. The May walk will be on Sunday 3rd May starting at 2.30 pm when we will meet at Ridge Green, by the bench at the junction of Mid Street and Kings Cross Lane, for a walk to Temple and Bransland Woods. **(Check with Robert in case these walks have to be cancelled)**

Gatwick Airport: Master Plan: NCS are maintaining contact with the various community groups that are preparing campaigns to oppose various aspects of the Plan. Their proposals include making a legal challenge supported by consultants' reports on traffic, building/planning regulations and environmental issues.

Heathrow Ruling: The Court of Appeal has ruled that the Government's case for Heathrow expansion, which formed the basis of the parliamentary vote in support of the project in 2018, failed to take proper account of its climate change impacts under the Paris Agreement. This is a win for the climate and totally undermines Heathrow's third runway plans. The UK has legislated to achieve net zero emissions by 2050. This ruling comes a few weeks after Bristol Council and Uttlesford Council rejected plans for expansion of Bristol and Stanstead airports respectively on the basis of their environmental impacts, including climate change. We consider these rulings will have implications for Gatwick's ambitions - it's hard to identify how any airport seeking new runways can reconcile such expansion with the scale of climate action and legislation. Heathrow will appeal and Gatwick will do everything they can to exploit the ruling to their advantage. We urge everyone opposed to such expansion at Gatwick to continue vigilance and take every opportunity to demonstrate opposition.

CAA Consultations: The CAA inundation of Consultations continues - we are now reviewing the latest “Public Engagement on the criteria for assessing and accepting the Airspace Change Master Plan”

Redhill Aerodrome: Taxiway/runway planning application. Progress remains ambiguous, it is unclear whether RBBC have received the documents they were anticipating receiving by the end of January. We have checked the planning application record and no documents have been listed as received since April 2019. The next planning meeting is scheduled for 18 March and this application is NOT on the agenda.

Nutfield Green Park Many residents will be aware of the clearance work carried out on behalf of developers. Please see our separate report for more information.

Local Plan: On 5 March the TDC officers responsible for producing the plan reported to The Planning Policy Committee meeting there are no indications when the Inspectors report will be delivered. They gave assurance that very shortly after receipt and examination details will be published on the TDC web site.

“ALL I NEED IS THE AIR THAT I BREATHE” ~ THE HOLLIES

In its 2018 report “Health matters: air pollution”, Public Health England (PHE) states, “Poor air quality is the largest environmental risk to public health in the UK, as long-term exposure to air pollution can cause chronic conditions such as cardiovascular and respiratory diseases as well as lung cancer, leading to reduced life expectancy.”

The report also states there is emerging evidence that air pollution is linked to dementia, cognitive decline and low birth weight, while the World Health Organisation’s research shows a link to higher rates of depression and suicide.

Children, older people and people with chronic health conditions are the most affected. According to Unicef, “As children breathe faster than adults, they take in more polluted air: an infant breathes in three times as much air as an adult, and a

six-year old breathes in twice as much, relative to their weight. And when children are walking or in a pushchair, they are often at the height of vehicle exhausts meaning that they breathe in higher concentrations of pollutants". Evidence suggests driving could be worse – according to Professor Stephen Holgate, an asthma expert at Southampton University, air pollution inside cars can be “nine to 12 times higher inside the car than outside” with pollution sucked in from surrounding vehicles.

In Surrey, a PHE report published in 2014 estimated that 5.7% of deaths are attributable to toxic air in over-25s. In Tandridge that's an estimated 41 deaths a year; in Reigate & Banstead, it's an estimated 69 deaths a year.

Most air pollution damage to health is caused by:

1. Nitrogen Dioxides (NO_x) - gases emitted from vehicles, especially diesel engines,
2. Particulate Matter (PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}) - microscopic particles absorbed into the bloodstream, emitted from quarries (dust), open fires, diesel engines etc.

Tandridge Council has NO_x tubes located at various points on the A25 to measure levels of NO₂ in the air. Results are shown on Tandridge's website and have previously exceeded the 40 ug/m² UK maximum limit in previous years.

In addition, campaign group TAG-A25, formed when residents in Nutfield, Bletchingley and Godstone raised concerns about air pollution on the A25, installed an additional tube outside Glebe Lodge on the A25 just before the motorway bridge. This includes particulate monitoring (something Tandridge does not have a statutory duty to monitor). To date, PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5} have not exceeded the 40 ug/m² limit.

So, with transport a major source of air pollution – as well as being responsible for a quarter of the UK's greenhouse gas emissions – making fewer journeys by car and plane can make a big difference. We all have a part to play.

According to Friends of the Earth, one fifth of this pollution happens during journeys of less than 5 miles: short journeys that can be made by foot or bike. For example, did you know that from the Village Hall, using a combination of footpaths and roads:

Priory Farm is under 1 mile away

East Surrey Hospital is under 2 miles away

Outwood Butchers, the M&S garage in Redhill & Redhill station are 2.5 miles away

What we can do:

- Walk or cycle more. If you do this for a daily commute once a week, that's a 20% reduction in that journey's emissions straight away
- Car share: consider offering or asking for lifts from friends, colleagues, etc where possible and safe to do so
- Never run your engine when stationary for more than a minute. This is a key factor in high pollution levels.

SOUTH NUTFIELD WEDNESDAY GUILD

At the start of the March meeting, Chairperson Mrs Sheila Coombs welcomed members new and old. Having completed the usual formalities and apologies for absence, Sheila introduced Mr Paul Hellyer, a volunteer with the charity Mercy Ships.

Mr Hellyer, a retired dentist, who was a volunteer with Mercy Ships, talked about the organisation, which has been in operation for 40 years. At present they have only one ship, the African Mercy Ship, but another is in the course of being built. The ship on which Mr Hellyer served as a dentist, with many other professionally qualified medical staff, is a fully equipped hospital with the latest technology, five operating theatres and 82 beds. It travels to countries in Africa, where it docks in a safe port area and remains for 10 months. In the remaining two months of the year it is in dry-dock in the Canary Islands.

Treatment is free of charge and naturally, when the ship arrives, thousands queue for an appointment and will be seen while the ship is in port. With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation Mr Hellyer showed photographs of before and after operations which had transformed people's lives. The ship also provides support and training for local health care staff. Mercy Ships welcomes volunteers for short or long stays and, in addition to those who are medically qualified, there is always need for support staff - ideal for gap year students. The ship has 450 cabins and has 1,300 volunteers annually, who stay for different lengths of time.

Sheila thanked Mr Hellyer for attending the meeting at very short notice and for his talk which had proved extremely interesting and enlightening.

WETTEST FEBRUARY ON RECORD

We have had 80% of the average annual rainfall between October 2019 and February 2020 (according to data from the last 10 years).

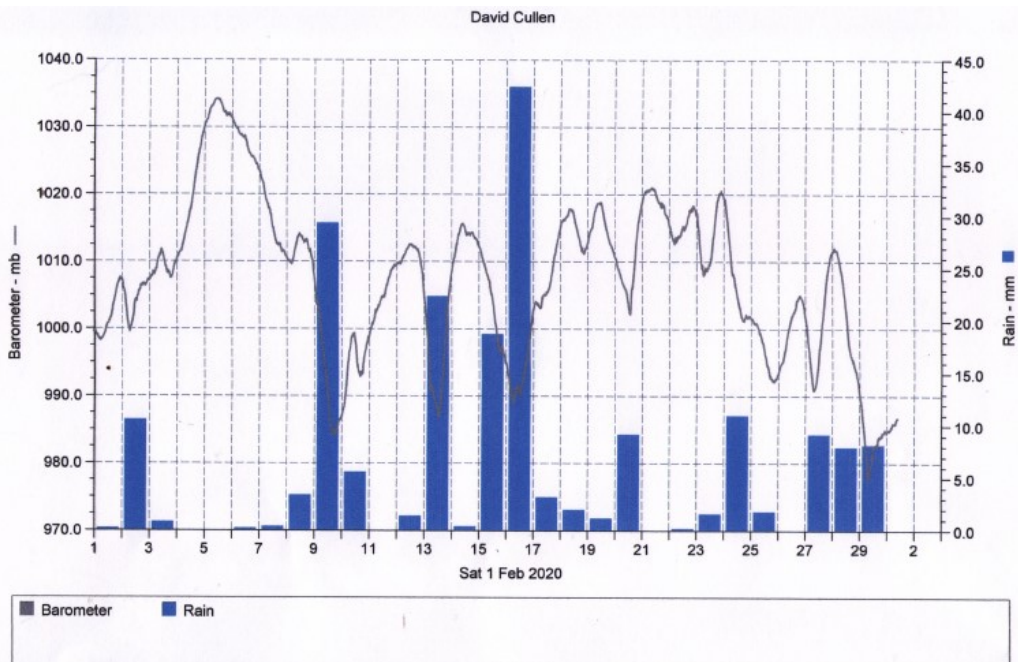
February 2020 has been countywide, the wettest February since Met Office records began, with an average of 202 mm (just under 8 inches).

In February my weather centre recorded 191.6 mm (7.5 inches) and we had some rain on 24 days. We also had three storms, Ciara on the 9th, Dennis on the 15th and 16th and finally Jorge between 27th and the 29th which caused severe flooding over diverse areas of the country, and as I write this flooding still persists.

I have made a tabulation and a graph to show the pattern of rain over the last 10 years together with another graph showing rainfall and barometric pressure over the course of February which shows quite clearly that rain is closely associated with falling pressure - all those old barometers can be very useful in predicting rain.

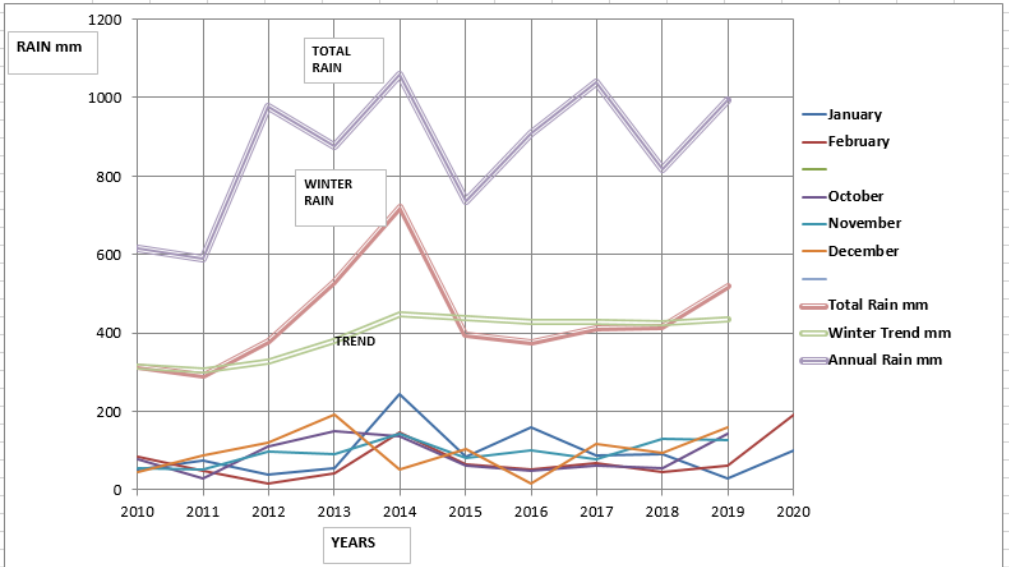
Let's hope that the jet stream moves north and lets us dry out and enjoy the spring and summer.

NUTFIELD GREEN PARK

(Update from Nutfield Conservation Society - March 2020)

In April 2019, proposals were published on our website regarding a potential development on land in Nutfield. The proposals were associated with ecological surveys that identified important species present on the site. Many residents will already be aware of the “works” carried out in late February 2020 by the developers on the land, although the owners have not yet submitted a planning application.

The developers gave notice of the recent works to NPC (who published the information in January’s link) and to SCC. The reasons given to those authorities differed and, in both cases, the level of damage to the land and ecology is inconsistent with the intentions they had advised. We are unaware of any rationale for the actual works carried out and the possibility remains that it is an attempt to diminish the ecological value of the site in advance of a planning application.

Following commencement of “the works”, Nutfield Conservation Society (NCS) received information and concerns from both residents and members. We responded by contacting SCC and TDC with a view to establishing if the works were lawful and hopefully to stop unnecessary disturbance to wildlife in that area. We also sent committee members to the site to gather, first-hand, information. This, together with information from residents, was passed to the authorities.

SCC and TDC are the authorities that have responsibility to investigate if any regulations have been broken and have the regulatory power to take action as necessary. We attempted to stimulate immediate action by the authorities to stop the works, although such immediate response did not occur. We continued to liaise with the authorities, and both ultimately sent representatives to the site although, at the time of their visits, the works had continued unabated and any damage had already been done. We are aware that SCC has since communicated to the developers that the works actually carried out are inconsistent with the works, they had previously advised were to take place.

Regarding birds and wildlife, there is no magic date to preclude clearance however those intending to clear land in a manner such as this case have obligations to examine the site and ensure birds and breeding wildlife are not to be disturbed. At the time of writing it is not clear if SCC have established if the developers complied with their obligations.

We are pursuing the matter with SCC to obtain clarification and also to establish if the original ecology reports have relevance to the clearance action taken. We believe that albeit the damage is done then, if necessary, an investigation should be undertaken and if it is established the developer has taken unlawful action then sanctions should be imposed.

Updates and information will be posted on our website. May we take the opportunity to thank our members and all other residents that have provided us with information and assistance.

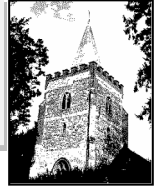

NEWS AND VIEWS FROM CHRIST CHURCH

SPRING TIME AND EASTER – HERE COMES THE SON

Spring is here once again, and so is Easter. After the long dark months of winter and the journey of Lent, there is promise of new life all around. The cycle of the seasons continues. Our lives often go in cycles too.

Twenty years ago in January 2000 my wife, Karen, and I joined Christ Church as we arrived to settle in England from South Africa – both returning to our British roots. We were part of Christ Church for three or four years during the ministry of Revd Tony Thompson. Then I took up a job with the World Bank in late 2003 in Washington DC where we stayed for several years.

After returning to England in 2009 we worshipped at St Mary's in Caterham. I went through training for the ministry and served a Curacy in Purley before joining the Merstham team for the past couple of years; now we have come full cycle and are back at Christ Church!

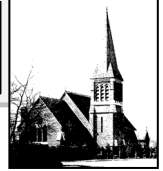
Change brings challenges, however – moving church and saying goodbye seems like a process of repeated bereavement and loss but then, without moving, we would not have met new good friends in so many other places. There is a fullness and a joy to being on the journey which brings a bitter-sweet richness with each cycle of leaving and arriving. We do not know how long we will be with Christ Church now - ultimately moving on again is inevitable – there is a time and a season for everything under the sun.

During this interregnum, Christ Church collectively has an opportunity to reflect on what God has in stall for the faith community and the community at large in South Nutfield through the current interregnum and beyond.

One of my favourite singers is Joan Baez (showing my vintage!) She sings a particular song masterfully – “God is God”. The song has three verses – the first is “God ain't me”, the second is “God ain't us”, and the third is “God is God”. Although the theology of some of the lyrics is a little suspect, the overall message is spot on. In our personal lives and the life of our church, it is not all about me and my personal walk with God – *God ain't ME!* Christ Church, like all other churches, exists within a community, most of whom seldom, if ever, cross the church's threshold. God does not belong in the church – *God ain't US!* Actually God is God – God has a plan for Christ Church, for South Nutfield, for each family and for each one of us, inside and outside the church – *God is God!*

So as you reflect on the future, the question should not be “What is our plan now? What should we do now?” Our question should be “What is God's plan, and how can we be part of it?”

CHURCH



Traditionally in the church the theological term is “Missio Dei” – the Mission of God. God is God and God is working year-by-year, minute-by-minute in Christ Church and South Nutfield and everywhere else – we have to get on the bus and be part of that work!

Karen and I are very privileged to be able to be with you on this part of your journey as a church as you seek new beginnings and a new cycle. We are here to support the community during this time of reflection and decision making, whilst also keeping the ordinary life of the church going.

I am currently “non-stipendiary” – I am a self-supporting priest and have other work through which I earn a living whilst I give two days a week to ministry work in the parish. In agreement with Bishop Christopher and Bishop Jonathan, I am going to be changing my ministry status. I am moving to stipendiary status to become a paid priest in the Diocese and serve as a vicar in a parish. I will be working with the Archdeacon and the Bishop to discern which parish I should serve in, after supporting Christ Church through the interregnum. So, my challenge is similar to that facing Christ Church – it is to find my next role in God’s mission, *Missio Dei*. This in fact is the role each one of us has – to be part of God’s mission wherever we are, individually and collectively.

At this Easter time, we are also part of a new cycle in the life of Christ Church, filled with the resurrected life of Jesus.

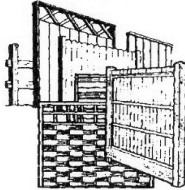
