

NEWS FROM TANDRIDGE DISTRICT COUNCIL

Residents will be aware that this Autumn some areas of the village suffered from serious flooding. Water entered houses causing considerable damage. A full report has recently been presented to Council on our response to this emergency. It is clear that arrangements made for the emergency telephone service did not meet the demand and this is to be improved. The Direct Works Unit of the Council did accomplish a considerable amount of cleaning up in the District and the Council does offer a limited courtesy clean up service. Tandridge has no statutory responsibilities in this area though it does operate as an agent of Thames Water in the maintenance of foul sewerage systems. Thames Water does offer a limited service and there is a leaflet outlining what is on offer. For further details ring 0345 200800. It seems to me that those of us affected by flooding must bear most of the cost on our house insurance.

The Inquiry on the proposed developments at Redhill Aerodrome will start on 23rd March. It is now vital that we unite in our efforts to defeat these proposals. Do we really want 1994 to be the year when our rural environment was destroyed? I would urge all readers to support the excellent work of the Consortium and KRAG.

I mentioned in December the proposed reorganisation of local government. It now appears that Tandridge will have to look toward Reigate and Banstead not Sevenoaks for a future merger into a new unitary authority.

As you clear up from Christmas and New Year celebrations, don't forget to use TDC recycling services! Collections for papers, cans and textiles will be on 14th and 28th January.

My next counselling sessions will be on Saturday 8th Jan at $10~\rm{am}$ at $150~\rm{Mid}$ Street and $11~\rm{am}$ at the Memorial Hall. Meanwhile I wish you all a happy and peaceful New Year.

CHRISTMAS 1993 I apologise for omitting to mention in the December Link the Parish Council's greetings to all parishioners for a happy and productive Christmas. I'll try to do better next year. However, let it be known that your parish council earnestly sends you all greetings in arrears and if you want to know what your parish council has done for you in 1993 please come to the Parish Annual General Meeting to be held at Memorial Hall, High Street, Nutfield, some time in March or April 1994, the firm date to be announced later.

PARISH CONSTABLE Further to the entry in the December Link, it was most unfortunate that the Surrey Constabulary called a meeting on the subject on November 24th at Oxted, the same night as the Police Liaison meeting at Bletchingley. I cannot inform you of developments until I receive a copy of the Minutes of the Oxted meeting. Perhaps next month.

HOGTROUGH LANE MIRROR This mirror has been out of action for some time due to vandalism but it has since been fixed and is, hopefully, in use to help motorists approaching the T junction from Philanthropic Lane to obtain a clear view right and left of traffic in Fullers Wood Lane. In rainy weather the mirror clouds over but this is due to condensation, not to council's lack of effort.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS 1994 At the Village Hall, Mid Street, South Nutfield: January 10th, February 14th, March 14th, May 9th, June 13th, August 8th, September 12th, November 14th, December 12th. At the Memorial Hall, High Street, Nutfield: April 11th, July 11th, October 10th.

MEMORIAL HALL FOOTBALL PITCH The junior team which uses this pitch in the season on Sundays has given notice that this will be their last season, so the pitch is free for the 1994/5 season. It has been reported that this is the best football pitch in East Surrey, so council is open to offers from other clubs.

LOCAL HIGHWAY MATTERS The Mid Street flooding and the huge pot-hole in Kings Cross Lane about 200 yards east of the church were reported to Surrey Highways on December 7th. Hopefully by the time you this this both will have been repaired.

CHANNEL TUNNEL RAIL FREIGHT In the November Link I mentioned the meeting at Westminster between parish council representatives and our MP and British Rail. Soon after this meeting I received a letter from British Rail saying the issues raised meant further consultation with technical officers, but nothing has been received since. This may be due to leaves on the line or faulty points or even the race-track at Tattenham Corner, but I must make mention to those residents very much concerned with this issue that as soon as I hear from British Rail I shall publish a contracted version of their findings.


Thank you again to all the volunteers who gave up their time and to Ken Hamilton for all his help in supplying the trees in the first place.



NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Last month the Home Secretary, Michael Howard, proposals for Neighbourhood Watch to adopt a higher profile in the fight against crime by means of local (passive) patrols - the guidelines of which have yet to be determined. There are however two schools of opinion on this matter. On the one hand, a great likelihood of witnessing & reporting crime, and on the other the potential for confrontation and possible violence. Other questions require clarification, eg the legal and insurance status of persons so engaged. Reaction to the proposal nationally has been mixed dependent upon the location of the respondents and the incidence of crime in their particular area. Locally, at the time of writing, there has been a negative response. I will be attending meetings in the New Year where this matter will be discussed with the Police authority and the Crime Prevention Panel, and will report in due course.



SOME MEMORIES OF NUTFIELD FROM A READER IN PAIGNTON

We lived at Braes Farm and Elaine Milson (nee Howick) sends me the Link. I pass it on to my sister in Brighton and Alan and Barbara Rosser (ex Morris Road) now living near Truro.

I have been reading the many War memoirs in the Link ... My mother has vivid and detailed memories of the burning B17 bomber crash landing at the Aerodrome, and says it was nothing short of a miracle that it made it that far.

My enduring memory is of the Canadian Road convoys which were routed up Bower Hill Lane, past the gate into the drive to Braes Farm. I can well remember that you could hear the convoys coming as far away at Earlswood. The semi-resident gang of lads playing on the farm was always on the listen out for them. At a mere hint of one coming we would rush down to the farm gate to meet the first vehicle. If it was a British convoy our enthusiasm soon died as our boys had very little to give away, but if it was an American convoy that was a different story. We would be up on the gate chanting the now immortal words "Got any gum chum?". Then from the backs of the personnel carriers would come chewing gum, chocolate and all manner of goodies. Literally manna from heaven, and we would be down in the dirt fighting over it.

Can you even imagine any such scene these days? That was the norm for us, and millions of other children, however.

You may find that the railway arch adjacent to Nellie Bates' cottage still bears the scars of those convoys. Trying to get a large tank on its transporter through that arch was like trying to get a quart into a pint pot!

I have a million other memories of South Nutfield, of course ... Best wishes to all


